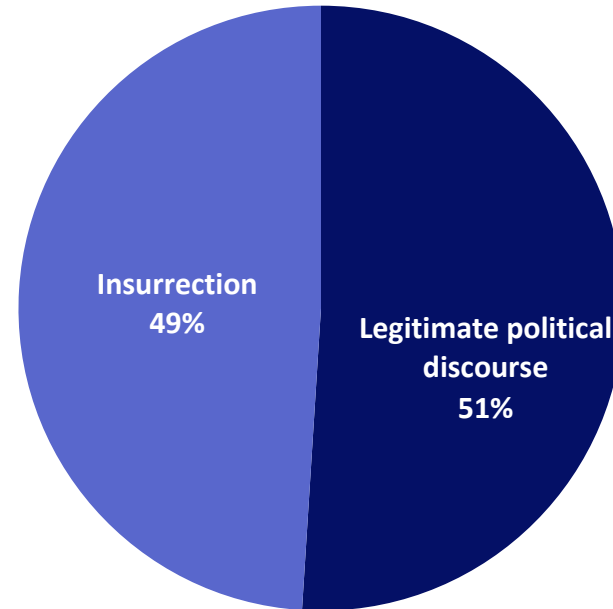


# TNDF Annual 2022 Polling

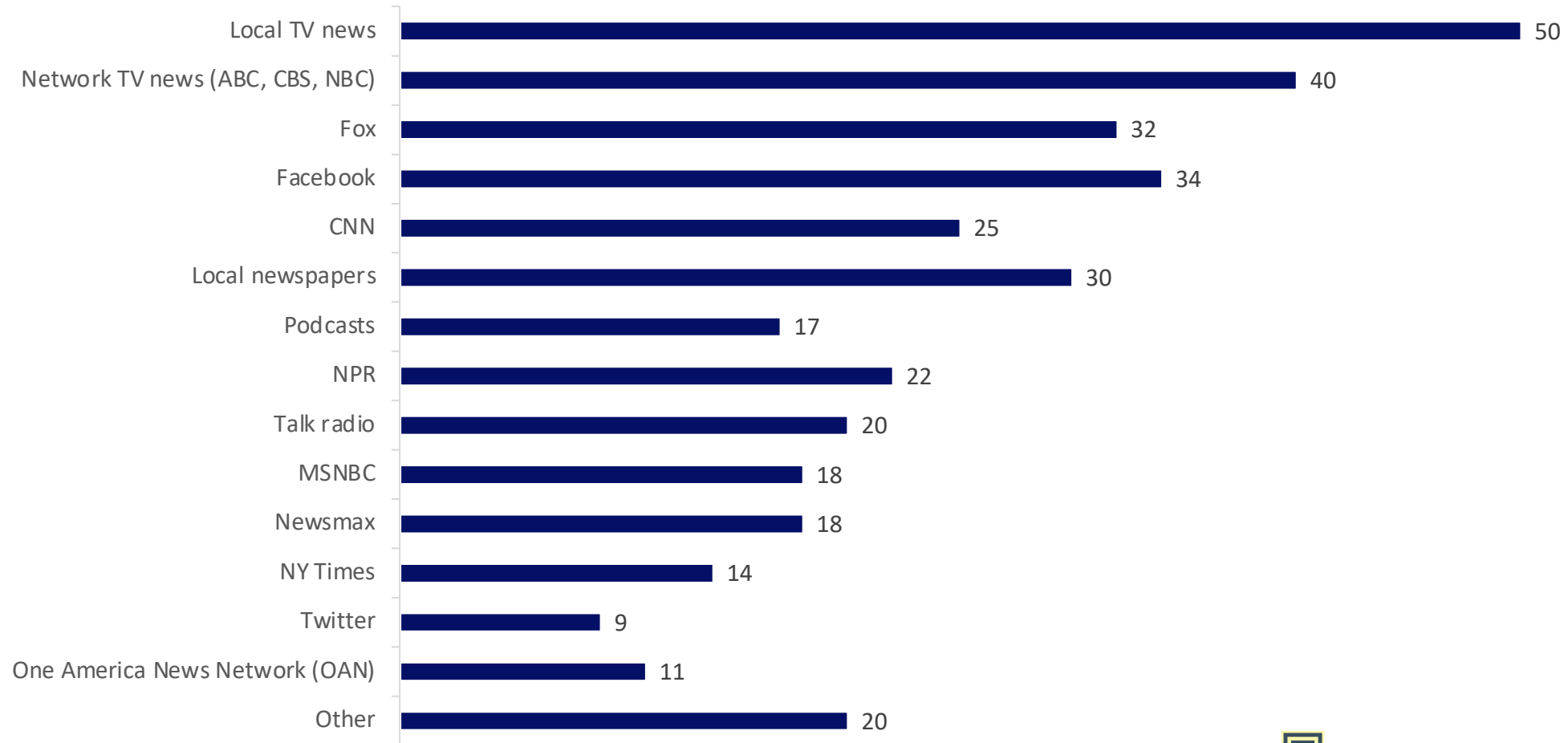

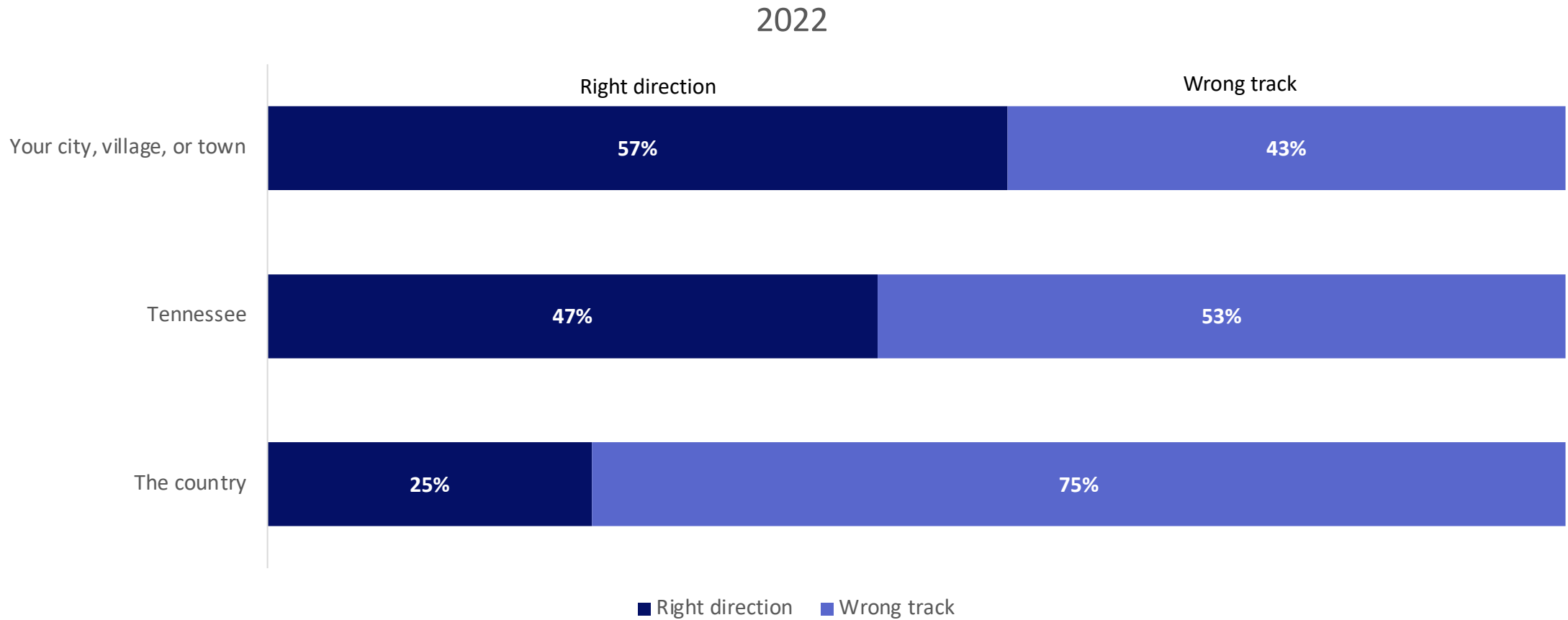

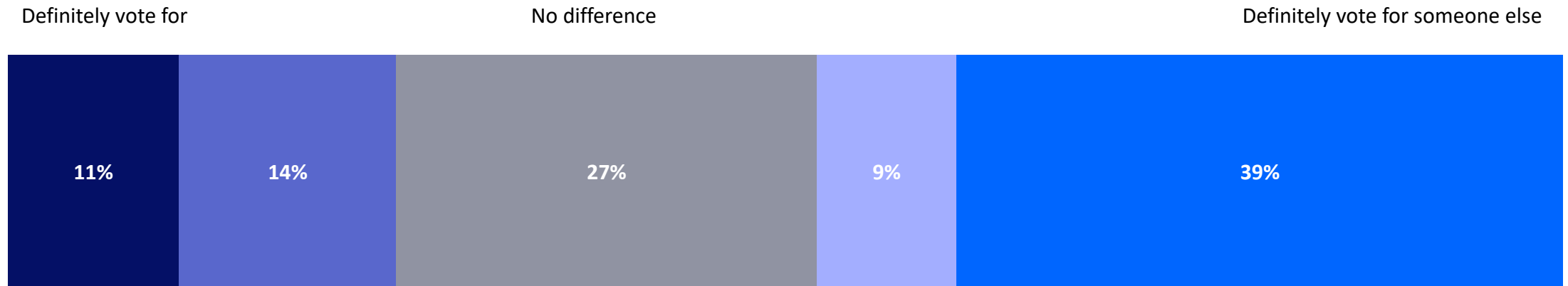
Regardless of who you voted for, who do you think won the 2020 presidential election?



How would you say things in the following areas are going? Are they going in the right direction, or are they off on the wrong track?

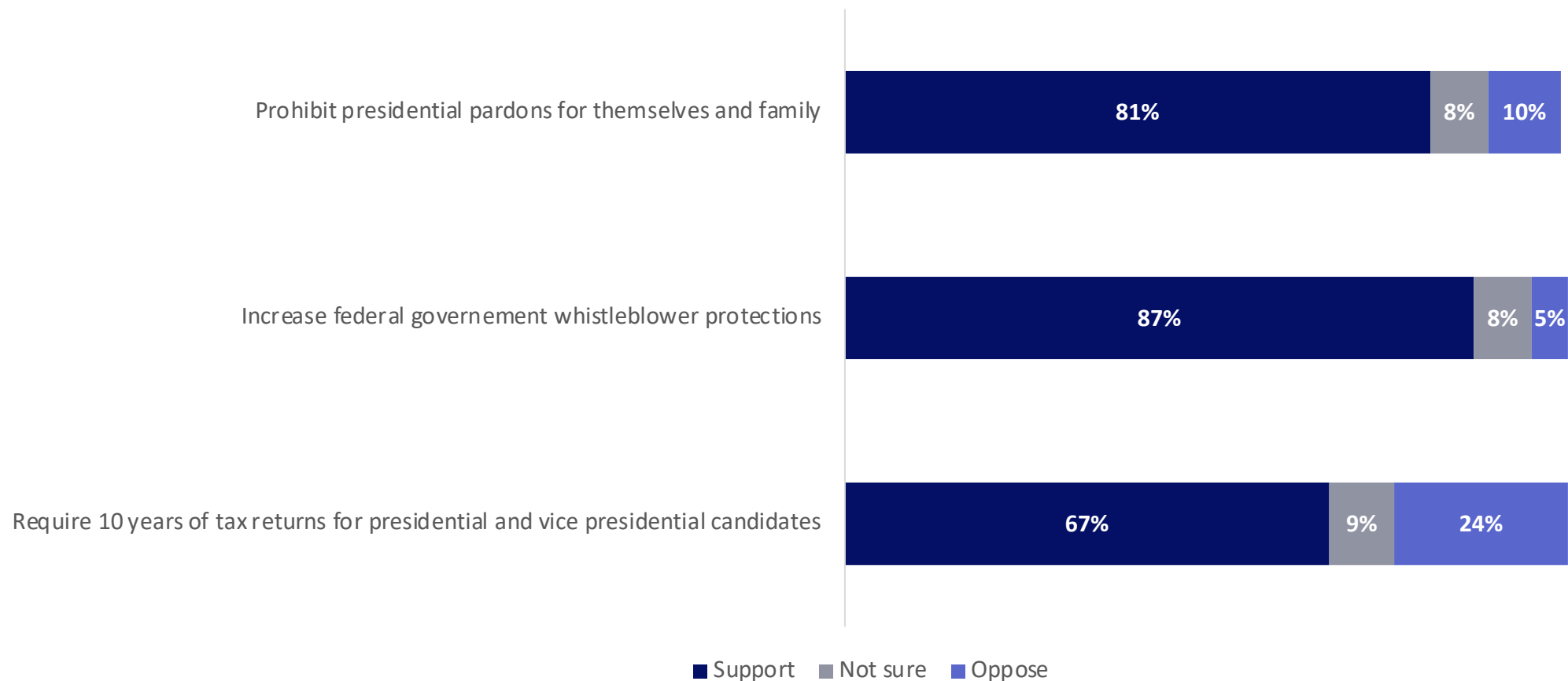

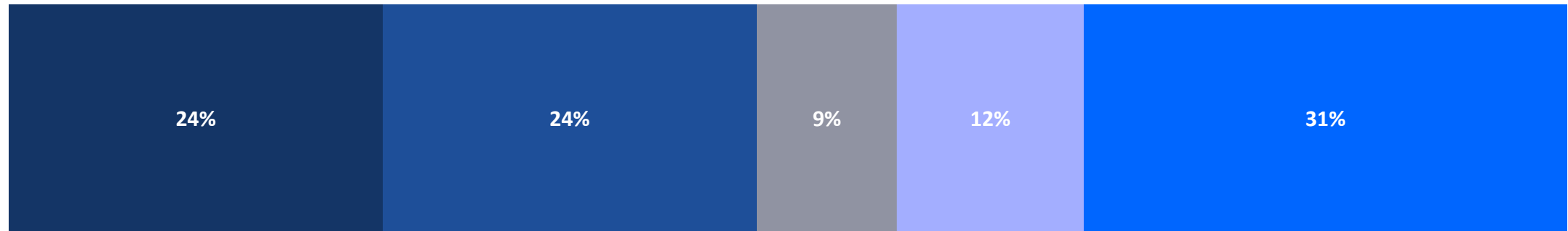

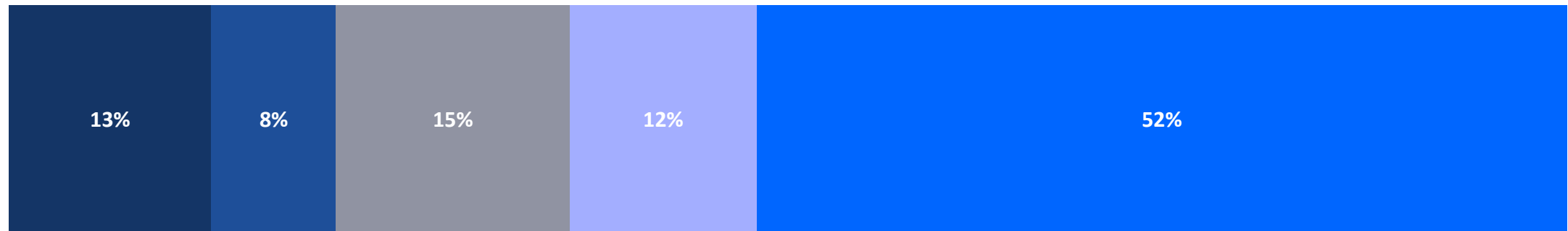


Would you support or oppose requiring all young men and young women in the U.S. to give one year of service to the nation, either in the military forces or in nonmilitary work, here or abroad?



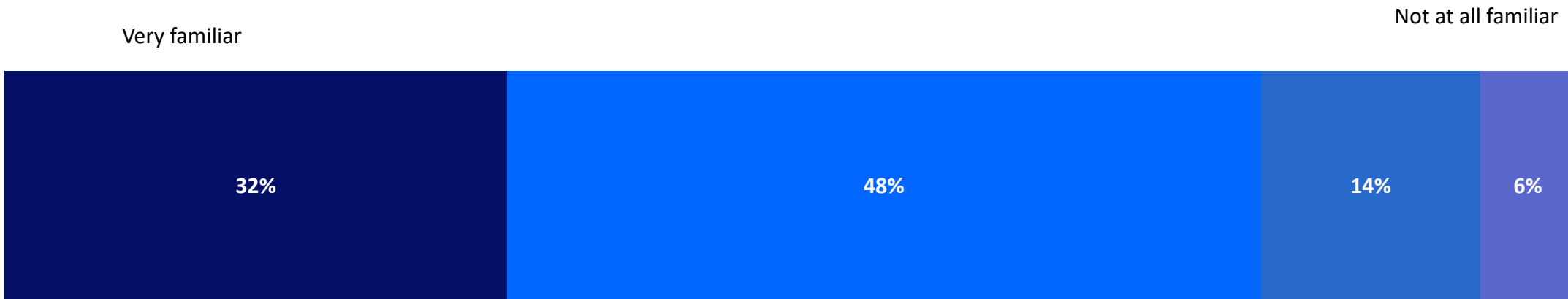

Thinking back to President Richard Nixon's administration, it has now been almost 50 years since the Watergate affair. How familiar are you with the Watergate affair?

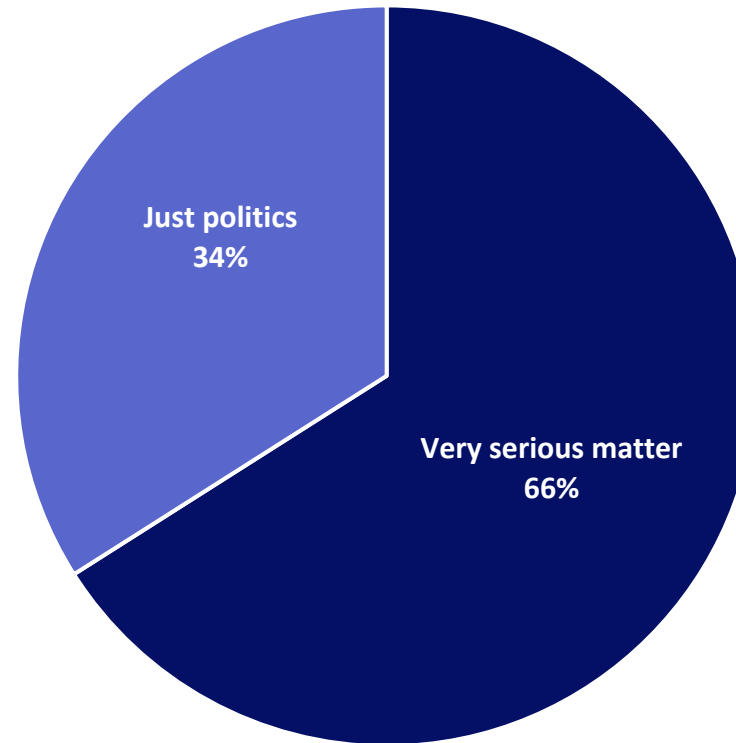

Which of these two statements comes closer to your point of view about Watergate, even if neither is exactly right?

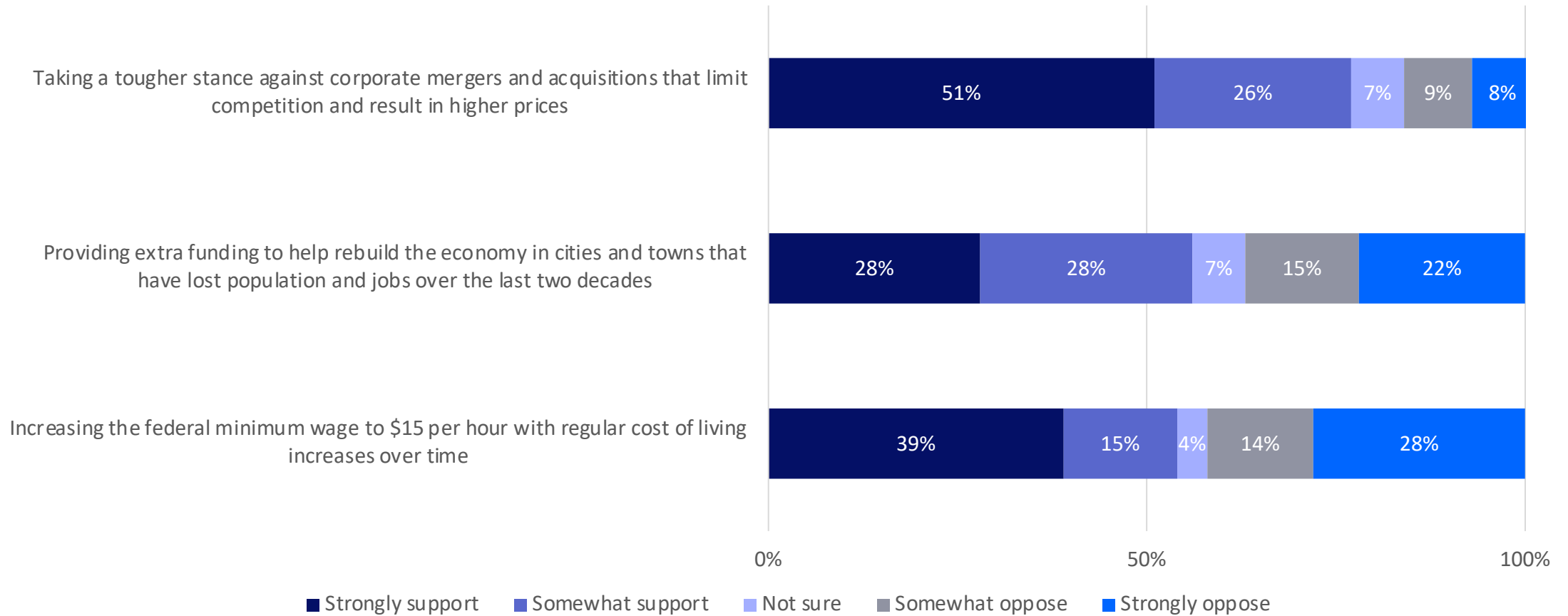
